

## Abstract Submission Guidelines

If you do not already have an Oxford Abstracts account, you will need to register as a new user.

Please sign in with your email address and password if you already have an account.

All abstract submissions are **not to exceed 250 words**.

Please note that if your abstract submission is successful, the presenting author is required to register for at least one day of the ACRA 2024 ASM.

## Categories

### 1. *Research Abstract*

Scientific research in the field of cardiovascular care with original data (including quantitative or qualitative studies) or review papers (systematic reviews, meta-analyses, other review types).

#### **Suggested Headings:**

- **Background:** Outline the knowledge gap. Why is this topic important? State the aim of the research.
- **Methods:** Succinctly describe the study design and methodology including the **P**opulation/problem; **I**ntervention/Exposure; **C**omparison/control (if applicable); and **O**utcome measure. What data were collected and how these were analysed/managed?
- **Results:** What were the main findings? Concisely present the analysed data and any table or figure.
- **Conclusions/Implications:** What can be concluded from the project? Keep the conclusions verifiable through the findings of the study. State the health/economic/policy implications of the study and considerations for future work.

## 2. *Clinical Abstract*

A clinical or quality improvement project that investigates an identified gap in clinical practice, tips for implementation of a new service model, or presentation of challenging clinical scenarios that promote discussion for potential improvements.

### **Suggested Headings:**

- **Background/Rationale:** Indicate why the topic is important (knowledge gap). Why was the project undertaken?
- **Methods:** Succinctly describe what was done and how, by whom, involving whom and where? What measurements/data were taken and how?
- **Outcomes:** What were the main findings/discoveries/learnings? Concisely present the analysed data
- **Implications for practice:** What are the clinical implications of this work? What can other clinicians learn? How might learnings from this project change practice?
- **Conclusions / Key messages:** What can be concluded from the project? Keep the conclusions verifiable through the findings of the study. State the health/economic/policy implications of the study and considerations for future work.

## 3. *Clinical Excellence Showcase*

Have you implemented an innovative practice or quality improvement project? Overcome a clinical challenge? Set-up a program or service which offers something a little out of the ordinary? These light-hearted presentations are designed to share ideas to improve cardiovascular care in a short, sharp, informative and fun way! We hope to leave delegates with at least one good, practical idea to implement in their own practice.

### **Suggested Content:** (These abstracts do not require structured headings)

- What was the problem you were faced with or gap you needed to fill?
- How did you go about it? What did you do? What steps did you take?
- What outcomes have occurred as a result of your innovation/project?
- Lessons learnt from the process that you can share with others
- What didn't work – we are interested to hear about this too!

## Presentation Formats

- **Prize session:** The four highest-scoring abstracts per category (research and clinical) will be chosen to present in a prize session. Each presenter will be allocated 10 minutes presentation time, plus 5 minutes for questions. This session will be judged by a panel of experts.
- **Oral presentation:** Each presenter will be allocated 10 minutes presentation time, plus 2 for questions.
- **Clinical Excellence Showcase:** Up to five presenters will be chosen to present in the Clinical Excellence Showcase. Each presenter will be allocated 5 minutes presentation time, plus 2 minutes for questions.
- **Moderated Poster:** The highest-scoring posters will be chosen to be presented in a moderated poster session. The presenter will be allocated 3 minutes presentation time, plus 1 minute for questions.
- **Poster:** Posters will be displayed for the duration of the conference program. There will be a dedicated informal Poster Session during the conference, during which time the presenter will be required to stand beside their poster.

## Review Process

All submissions will undergo blind peer-review by the Scientific Committee and abstract examiners. The Scientific Committee will select abstracts to be part of the final program considering the balance of the program.

### **Abstracts will be marked on the following criteria:**

- Conciseness and clarity of information
- Quality and appropriateness of study design/intervention
- Results/scientific merit
- Clarity of conclusions
- Impact and significance
- Innovation

Abstract submission closes on **22<sup>nd</sup> March 2024 (Friday) 23:59.**

All abstract submitters will be notified of the outcome of their submission at the **end of April 2024.**
